
RACECOURSE DIAGRAMS AND THE COURSE BOARD

CAUTION: The design of the course board allows the plaques to **drop into the lake!**


- A **Red** plaque means marks rounded to Port (This is normal). **Green** marks to Starboard.
- Remember that the course board reads from the racers' left to right. It is easy to get this backwards.
- If **anything but port roundings** I would also verbally let them know by using the **come within hail** flag.
- The two most used courses are the Modified Windward/Leeward and the Modified Olympic because
 it gives the competitors the greatest opportunity to show their skill and is easiest for the Race
 Committee to run.
- Any course with a separate start and finish takes **two** committee boats.








